Col. (Ret.) Charles Washington Retires from HIRRS Board

Col. Charles Washington, one of HIRRS' most beloved Board members, announced his retirement from active service to the Board in October 2013. Earlier this year, tragedy struck the Washingtons as Col. Washington's son, William, passed away unexpectedly. This, coupled with a desire to see his wife through a difficult medical diagnosis, influenced Col. Washington's decision to reduce his Board responsibilities.

Col. Washington was an original member of the Board of Directors at HIRRS, beginning service in 1991. Through the years, his leadership, knowledge and genuine concern for the staff of HIRRS and individuals with brain injury have been incomparable. During his tenure, he has witnessed HIRRS' growth from an agency that served four individuals to one that

currently provides support to over 100 individuals a year.

Col. Washington has been granted the status of Director Emeritus by the HIRRS Board for his years of service to the agency.





What is your favorite TV show?


Spongebob Squarepants and Looney Tunes. I also like the Charlotte Church talk show on YouTube.

What is your job title at HIRRS? *Director of Admissions and Quality Assurance*

What's a typical day on the job like for you? *I do a lot of troubleshooting in my job so I am on the phone a lot and writing and answering emails. I also research information for program development ideas and materials. I speak with funding sources such as DDA, DORS and the TBI Waiver to help prospective clients get funding.*

What's the most satisfying part of your job? *Being able to help an individual or their family get the help they need, whether its receiving services here at HIRRS or other programs, obtaining benefits such as SSI or finding doctors, therapists that can meet their needs.*

What's the hardest part of your job? *Having to tell people that they can't get services here because they don't have funding.*

What did you study in school? *I have a BA in Psychology with a minor in special education*

How do you decide if a person is a right candidate to be a client at HIRRS? *The directors and I look at an individual's records, i.e. neuro-psychological, medical, etc., we meet with them and their family and see what their needs are and whether we can meet their needs with the expertise we have. We also look at the individual's personality to see if they will be able to get along in our environment.*

How long have you been at HIRRS? *16 years*

If you could do anything else, what would you do? *I would have my own energy work practice doing Reiki with people and animals.*

What's been the biggest change at HIRRS since you started? *The company has really grown in size and the types of services we provide have evolved so we are more comprehensive and able to provide a variety of programs to meet individuals' needs.*

What are your hopes for HIRRS in the future? *That we continue to evolve and grow. Adding new services and improving existing ones. To have new ways to fund people with brain injuries so they can get services would allow us to re-focus on what we do best, which is cognitive re-training and community re-entry.*

What do you do for a living? How long have you been doing this? I'm currently a 6th grade English teacher and Team Leader at Ridgeview Middle School. I have been at Ridgeview for ten years...if you count the two I spent there as a student. Since becoming a teacher in 2004, I have taught 2nd grade, 6th and 7th grade Reading and English, 8th grade TV Studio, and 8th grade drama. I also coach the girls' soccer team.

What do you like most about your job? The fact that I don't have to sit in front of a desk all day. I feel like what I do definitely impacts other people on a daily basis. In my ten years of teaching, I can say I never liked my job as much as I do this year. I just feel like I'm finally in a position where I can be successful.

How do you spend your free time? Right now, my free time is extremely scarce.
